


Educational Activity #2

Ancestors spoke one or more dialects of the Yugambeh Language.


Colour in or paint the animals with a dot painting style and learn to count in Yugambeh language! Full page animals can be found on the following pages.

Tip: Use the end of a paintbrush or a cotton tip to create the dot painting style.






Jalumin (Fish)




Borob

(Koala)




